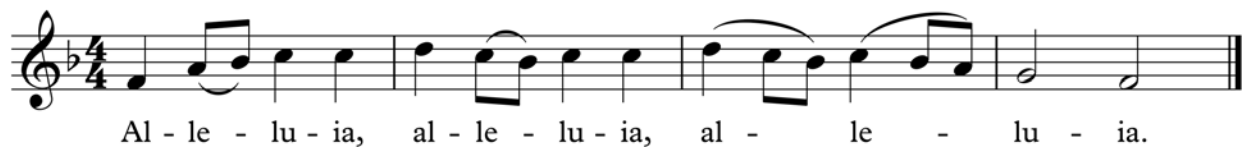
SECOND READING | 1 THES 1:1-5B
