## FIRST READING | IS 5:1-7

Lector: A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

**L**et me now sing of my friend, my friend's song concerning his vineyard.  
My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside;

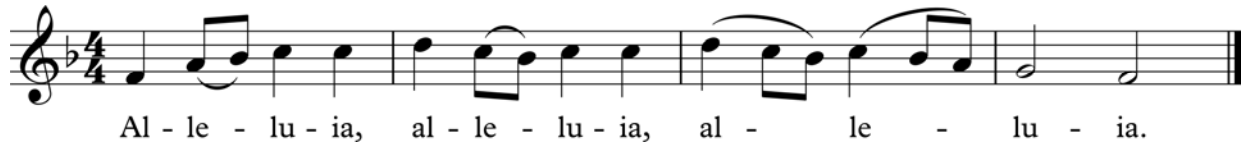
