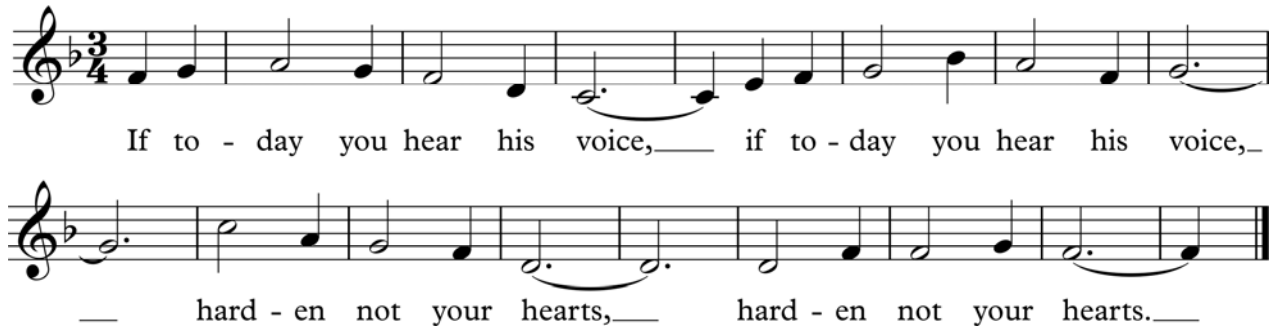
FIRST READING | EZ 33:7-9

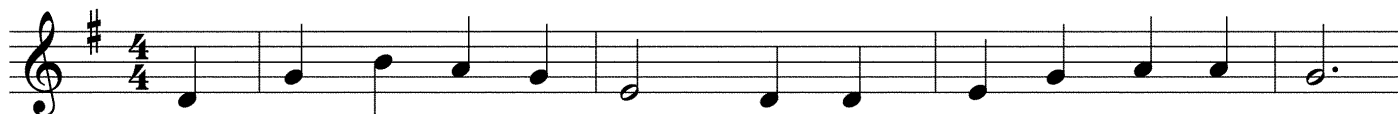

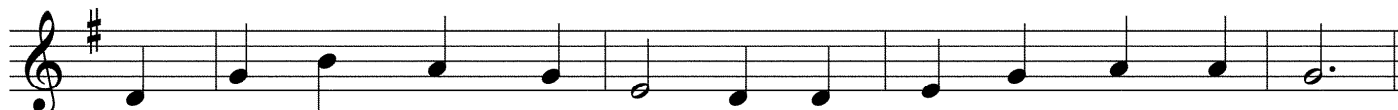
SPIRITUAL COMMUNION


ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL PRAYER
