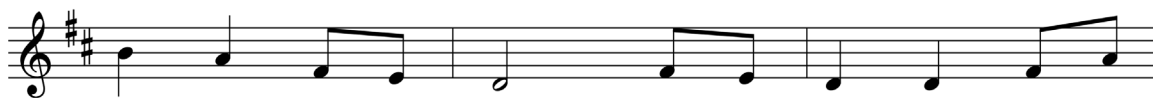
Final Blessing & Prayer to St. Michael

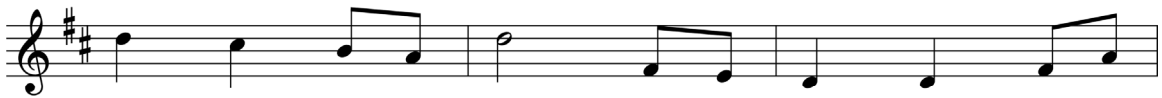

EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES SERIES

Eucharistic Miracle of CIMBALLA

SPAIN, 1370

In the year 1370, the pastor of Cimballa was assaulted during the Mass with a strong doubt about the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Host transformed into Flesh, and Blood began to flow onto the altar linens. The episode re-enforced the wavering faith of the priest who penitently retired to a monastery, dedicating himself to a life of penance and prayer. Every year on the 12th of September, the memory of the miracle in the parish church is celebrated where, even now, the relic of the corporal soaked in the Blood is kept.

While we receive the parking passes for Sundays for free from the garage (and we are so grateful for that), these additional passes St. John's will be paying for.

****Please DO NOT park in the alley adjacent to the Church and Parish Office.** The alley will be reserved primarily for staff and those who need to be in the office on a regular basis during the week and on Sundays. **All vehicles must have a parking pass in the alley or they will be towed.****
