EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES SERIES

Eucharistic Miracle of ETTISWIL

SWITZERLAND, 1447



At Ettiswil, there is a shrine dedicated to a Eucharistic Miracle that happened in 1447. Ann Vögtli, a member of a satanic sect, was able to steal the pyx containing the large Host from the parochial church. The Host was found close to a fence in the middle of some nettle bushes, lifted high up and surrounded by a vivid light, and was divided into seven pieces which were joined together so that they looked like a flower. The miracle was discovered by Margaret Schulmeister, who has a swineherd. Today there is a chapel built over where the Host was found and the local chapel celebrates this miracle each year on "Laetare" Sunday and on the two following days.

NEW PARISH HALL WORK HAS BEGUN!



As you may know, the St. John parking lot is now closed until the construction of the new parish hall is complete this summer. Thank you for your patience as we work to make the much-needed on-site parish hall a reality over the coming months.

As always, for Sunday Masses, our regular parking passes will work with parking available for 2 hours free in the Plaza Park Garage on Capitol Ave and then 3 hours free in the Mall Garage (World of Wonders) on Illinois Street. Please plan accordingly based on how long you will be at St. John's on Sunday. These parking passes are available following Mass from one of our greeters in the back of church.

If you are coming for a meeting at St. John's during the week, we are working with the Capitol Ave (Plaza Park) garage on parking passes. This garage also has full-time security on staff as well. We will be communicating directly with groups who will receive parking passes. If you are unsure if you'll receive a parking pass, please reach out to the ministry team leader who is in charge of the event or meeting to receive info about parking. While we receive the parking passes for Sundays for free from the garage (and we are so grateful for that!), these additional passes St. John's will be paying for.
